

202-A01 Tracing programs which are using pointers

Work to do

You can do this exercise purely on paper, using and filling the table provided to you below. Make sure that you also note if a given line would cause a bug and explain its nature.

It is also a good idea to type this code and compile it then add to it a bunch of printf statements to double check that your trace is actually correct. When you do so, you will come up with questions (e.g. "I thought it worked this way, why is the printf telling me otherwise) which you can post on the course's forums to get help with.

If you do not verify your trace by implementing the code you will probably leave errors in it which you will commit again at our next exam. Warn be thee.

Here is the program you will have to trace;

#include <stdio.h>
int main ()
{
1.   int array[5] = { 0,1,2,3,4} ;
2.   int * p1, **p2 ;
3.   int * parray[2] = { NULL , NULL };
4.   p1= & array[2] ;
5.   *p1 = 20 ;
6.   p2 = & p1 ;
7.   ** p2 = 30 ;
8.   *p2 = NULL;
9.   parray[0] = & array[0];
10.  parray[1] = & **p2;
11.  *parray[0] = 30 ;
12.  *parray[1] = 300;
}
```

Use the table on next page to trace its execution line per line by hand.
